# What does sexual harassment at work look like?

- Deliberate verbal comments of a sexual nature, suggestive remarks, ridicule and offensive jokes.
- Physical contact such as sexual assault, touching, pinching, patting, hugging and brushing against another person's body.
- A display of offensive or erotic pictures.
- Sexual teasing, practical jokes, sexual name-calling or 'stirring'.
- Sexually suggestive looks or gestures such as leering, ogling or staring.
- Unwanted requests of a sexual nature.
- Continuous requests or pressure to develop a relationship.
- Persistent questions or comments about a person's private life, such as asking "do you have a boyfriend?"
- Considering a person's physical attributes rather than their skill or experience.
- Sexually based emails and 'text' and direct messages, this would also include messages with sexual innuendos.

We have legislation that makes sexual harassment unlawful, yet 1/3 women report being sexually harassed in the workplace.

If you are being sexually harassed, you have options. The process is about you and your choices.


You can have a confidential chat with us about the different ways we can support you. This might be legal advice. It might be other options for resolving your matter. It could be support from one of our social workers. It could mean referrals for other services and supports that can help you.

If the sexual harassment has affected you financially, we also have financial counselling available. Problems rarely happen in isolation, you may also have other things you need to talk about. We can also help with eg family law, family and domestic violence, child safety matters, and victims of crime compensation.
